SCHOOL COMMUNIQUE

Wild Waterworks wants the safest environment for all patrons while visiting our facility.

New regulations under the Health Protection and Promotion act affecting public pools have been put into place by the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long Term Care.

- As operators of Wild Waterworks we must abide by the changes in the legislation.
- As an operator we must follow the regulation which states the following:

That every owner and every operator of a Class A pool shall ensure that there is a process in place to ensure a guardian or designated person supervises children 10 years of age and under. The process must include a swimming competency test and a method of communicating the requirements of the process. O. Reg 494/17, s.13(10) 565

LIFEJACKETS:

Wild Waterworks will be requiring anyone 10 years of age and under to wear an approved lifejacket/PFD in the Wave Action Pool and the Eazy River in lieu of a swim competency test. For supervision of those 10 years of age and under, the guardian or designated person, 16 years of age or older, must be within arm's reach at all times while in the water and the following ratios must be adhered to.

RATIOS:

Children under age 6: Two children with a lifejacket/PFD to one guardian (2:1) 16 years of age or older.

Children aged 6 to 10: Eight children with a lifejacket/PFD to one guardian (8:1) 16 years of age or older.

- Wild Waterworks uses the OPHEA guideline for swim tests for students who are visiting on school trips. The OPHEA guideline states:

SWIM TEST:

An initial screening/testing of swimming ability must be demonstrated in shallow water to a certified swimming instructor/lifeguard prior to swimming.

To be designated "a swimmer" students must be able to tread water for 1 minute and swim 50m (164').

To meet the requirements of the new regulations students 10 years of age and under must wear an approved Lifejacket/PFD in the Wave Pool and the Eazy River, regardless of whether they can swim or not.

SWIM TEST PART 1:

In the wave pool, students 11 years of age and older must swim across and halfway back, without touching the bottom, to satisfy the 50m requirement. To meet the swim test requirement, Wild Waterworks has four (4) National Lifeguards in the wave pool (waves will not be on) at a depth of 44" (1.1176 m) along with a buoy line delineating the shallow and deep ends.

Students must successfully pass Part 1 of the swim test portion to move on to Part 2.

SWIM TEST PART 2:

In the wave pool the student will be required to perform 1 minute of treading water at a depth of no more than 44"(1.1176m) at the buoy line area of the wave pool.

There will be a minimum of two (2) National Lifeguards in the water with the students.

Those students who pass both parts will be provided with a wrist band identifying them as swimmers.

This will be documented on the class list that is provided by the teacher.

Anyone who is 11 years of age and older and is deemed a non-swimmer must be identified and wear a properly fastened Personal Flotation Device (PFD) for recreational swims. As per OPHEA guidelines, correctly fitting and Transport Canada approved PFD/lifejacket must be worn by identified non-swimmers.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Wild Waterworks will have lifejackets/PFDs available on a first-come, first-serve basis free of charge for student use. They will be on racks, located near the Wave Action Pool and Eazy River. Staff will be available to assist with sizing and answer questions. Wild Waterworks allows students to bring in their own approved Lifejacket/PFD for use in the Wave Action Pool and Eazy River, as supplies are limited.

Lifejacket/PFDs must be approved by: Transport Canada, Oceans and Fisheries Canada, Canadian Coast Guard and USA Coast Guard Type I, 2 or III.

Swim tests that have been conducted at facilities outside of Wild Waterworks will not be accepted.

In lieu of completing the swim test, students may provide proof of Bronze Medallion certification or higher.

The lifeguard and outside provider must be made aware of the swim test results.
